Road to be named in honor of former Greenville councilman

During his 28 years as a trooper for the Indiana State Police, Hanzel Barclay cruised many roads and interstates before retiring and eventually serving on the Greenville Town Council.

As a fitting tribute, residents of the small Floyd County town will soon be able to remember the Air Force veteran every time they drive or take a stroll down Hanzel Barclay Drive.

He was the first known councilman to die while still in office when he passed away unexpectedly March 27 of a heart attack. Barclay's peers on the council decided to honor him by renaming the street he resided along in the Parkland Heights subdivision.

"He was a great guy. The best thing about him was that he was a quiet person, but he was fair and honest and always had the best interest of the town and citizens that he represented," Councilwoman Patti Hayes said.

A ceremony is slated for 4 p.m. Sunday in front of Barclay's old home at 6125 Woodland Drive, where his wife still resides. The street name will then change following the event.

Both of Barclay's sons followed in his footsteps to

serve as ISP troopers, a job he retired from in 1995. Jim Pierce took Barclay's place on the council after his passing.

Hayes lives in Parkland Heights and remembers talking with Barclay about issues concerning Greenville before she decided to seek public office.

"It's been rough for me. I don't know if it was because we were practically neighbors — I feel the void, I really do," she said.

Council President Talbotte Richardson said it was a shock when the visibly healthy Barclay died from a heart attack. He described his former fellow councilman as passionate and respectful.

"He served the community well — he was always available to the community," Richardson said.

Greenville street named after former councilman

Hanzel Barclay died suddenly in March

Greenville has made a first for the town's history.

During a warm, sunny Sunday, several Greenville Town Council members joined together with a former council member's family and friends to remember and honor his life and name.

In Greenville's history, there has never been a street changed to honor a person who served the town. On Sunday, however, Woodland Avenue was officially changed to Hanzel Barclay Drive, named after the former councilman who suddenly died earlier this year.

Barclay and his wife moved to Woodland Avenue in 1969, a street next to the Parkland Heights subdivision. New construction has removed a forest behind their house that Connie Barclay said she admired.

"The trees were also much smaller then," she said about their front yard. Their house is situated directly across from the new street sign. "At first it was hard for me to look out my window and see his name. It made it all too real. But I think he would be honored."

Barclay was the first to die while on the Greenville Town Council. He died March 27 of a heart attack.

"You would never have known he was sick," Council President Talbot Richardson said. "It was a terrible shock."

Richardson said Barclay enjoyed hunting and going on trips.

"Nobody does anything for the 'town' man," Richardson said.
"Roads get named after presidents, but not the 'town' man."

Neighbors walked to Barclay's home where his family and friends gathered on a shady lawn Sunday, setting up lawn chairs, talking about the new road name and Barclay's life. His two sons pulled up, dressed in full uniform, on their Indiana State Police motorcycles. Like their father, Timothy and David Barclay became Indiana State Troopers.

"We're proud that the street we grew up on our whole life is named after him," David said. "Now his grandkids can see the street sign and realize that this was his street."

"This is good for my mom," Timothy said. "She was really proud of him and it meant a lot to her."

Commemorative plagues were gifted to Barclay's wife and her

"I believe he (Barclay) is here," said Patti Hayes, who was in charge of the street's name change. Hayes also serves on Greenville's Town Council. "I miss Hanzel — he was my comrade. I hope that I can continue his vision."
