

# Summit School Board Meeting

January 10, 1912  
School Room

Erny Boy opened the meeting. All members were present. Erny Boy, Donald Hill, Robert Gibson and Harry Jacob, clerk-treasurer. Also present Farnley Burkhart, Union Commissioner, Charles Fickler, town marshal, Urson McLown and Sonny Sprigler.

Urson McLown turned things he had on file pertaining to the town over to the newly elected board.

Farnley Burkhart turned over many things that were his responsibility to Harry Jacob, Clerk-treasurer. The other books have not been audited and Farnley Burkhart retained papers that would be pertinent to the audit by the State Board of Accounts.

Sonny Seigler said that he had purchased a 34 acre tract near the American Bank in Tulsa. He wants to develop and place 50 to 55 houses on the land. He asked the water company to service these homes. He proposed to install the lines and have them inspected by an inspector approved by the board. His proposal was granted subject to review by our water engineers at Sapulpa, Ok.

Mr. Burkhardt had a request from Don Marshall for service to some home sites. The property is part of the Friendly Inn and the board will accompany Mr. Burkhardt to look into difficulties this service may present.

The board voted to give township Burkhardt, water commissioner, an eight percent raise due to an eight percent (8%) increase in number of water customers. This complying with the original contract.

Urnson Nelson wants to blacktop some streets and extend the water line some 150 feet at his expense. The board voted that this would be granted if the work is done properly.

Charlie Biddle, town Marshall, reported several minible rides in our community. He has been warning the rides about the proper and legal use of these vehicles. The stop (stop) sign on the road leading from the school was discussed. Any action was tabled until the school year is over.

The board agreed that Gary Jacob should purchase two (2) filing cabinets and supplies. One each for the clerk, treasurer and the board president. They also agreed to have the town cars lettered in identifying letters. Wilson Sears is to continue as deputy town Marshall. The board was in agreement that Jerry Boyz would be the new town board president.

Claims were presented and approved by the board. These claims appear in the treasury records.
