Aug. 1<sup>st</sup> was opened the meeting, the  
minutes from the last meeting and the  
treasurer's report were read and approved.  
Claims were presented and approved  
for payment all members were present.

Thursley, Burkhardt submitted the water  
and Mississippi boundary report, it coincides  
with the bank statement. Charles Willis,  
town Marshall stated there are many  
logs running loose in the Township  
he has received complaints. Aug. 1<sup>st</sup> is  
to check with the County and attorney  
to see if any State laws exist, pertaining  
to unbroken logs. If so, we will attempt  
to use the state laws to correct the  
situation.

Robert Wilson moved that if a person  
spends more than a \$150.00 attending  
a water fair to service their property  
that at one time only \$150.00 adjust  
be granted to these persons. The Tax

or fee will remain \$50.00 per meter  
and the intended line will built to  
our water company specifications  
and be inspected by our water  
company inspector.

The town dump was discussed.  
It is no longer used, and the board  
feels the land should be sold.  
The trash in the dump needs to  
be covered before it is tabled until  
a later meeting.

Kelart Glass stated that the  
park road should be opened to  
Greenville Park to facilitate getting  
into the park. Greg McAll is to  
find out whether the C.C.I. money  
could be used for the purpose.

Tom Till moved that the meeting  
be closed.
