Terry Boaz opened the meeting. All members were present.

The minutes from the last meeting and the monthly treasurers' report were read and approved. Claims were presented and approved for payment.

Four visitors, Farnsley Burkhart and Charles Birkla attended the meeting.

Donald Uhl stated that the town needs to put up some "STOP" signs on our town streets. Mr. Uhl is to see that needed signs are erected.

Parking around the Greenville Georgetown road and U.S. 150 intersection is causing a traffic problem. Discussion ensued, but no action was taken.

Marvin Sears stated that gravel is needed in places along the sides of the Greenville Georgetown Road for safety. Donald Uhl is to see if the county will spread some stone in the troubled areas.

The State Board of Health will not at this time permit a two hundred (200) home subdivision in Galena area as proposed by Mr. Jack. They feel that we would not have enough water to service the additional customers. Midwest engineers at Lagoootee feel we can handle 1200 customers. We presently have as of January 1, 1972, 513 customers. We must abide by the State Board of Health's decision.

Farnsley Burkhart stated that the State Board of Health wants to know and approve any water line that would be laid that is four (4) inches or larger.




James Hartfield requested water service for his home site. The line will only be extended a few feet. This was approved by all the board.
