The regular monthly meeting of the Greenville Town Board was held at the Town Hall. The meeting was called to order by President Jack Sprigler, with all board members in attendance. Others present were Talbotte Richardson, Gary Getrost and other interested persons.

Minutes of the April meeting were approved. Financial statements were presented to the board.

A request was made at the last meeting to have two alleys opened, but after careful consideration the board voted against opening but the town will mow the right-of-way whenever needed, the motion was made by Mr. Miller and seconded by Mr. Spears.

The board will withhold their decision on the swampy ground problem, until later.

Town Marshall Talbotte Richardson made the recommendation to keep the Chevy Police Car and sell the Dodge, only one car is needed and the Chevy meets Town best. Mr. Miller made the motion to sell the Dodge to the highest bidder and reserve the right to reject any and all bids, also to get the Blue Book price. Mr. Spears seconded the motion.

Mr. Muddeman reported that the Ramsey "main water meter" was registering 1300 gallons per minute and was only pumping 1000 gallons per minute, Ramsey is putting in a new meter and will reimburse for the last year and a half. Ramsey service to us will be taken over by Floyd Knobs and should be able to sell us water, have two months to decide. We will have Mr. Mason to check our contract with Ramsey.

Bartron painting Service presented their Water Tower painting service. The board will have the tank inspected by Mr. Richardson and if it needs painting we will advertise and let bids. We are to send Mr. Bartron a card within three weeks.


The board on motion of Mr. Spears, seconded by Mr. Miller voted to buy two new Pumps and a new hot water heater for the Water Plant.
