Minutes of Greenville Special Meeting June 22th, 2010

Council President Talbotte Richardson called the special meeting to order. Other Councilpersons present were James Pearce, Patti Hayes, and Randal Johnes, along with Clerk Jack Travillian. The meeting was opened by the Pledge of Allegiance followed with a prayer.

The following Ordinances and Resolutions were discussed or passed by the Council:

Confirming Resolution 2010-R-036 CONFIRMING RESOLUTION CONCERNING CARRYOVER OF VACATION TIME EARNED BY WATER UTILITY SUPERINTENDENT GARY GETROST OF THE GREENVILLE WATER UTILITY OF THE TOWN OF GREENVILLE, INDIANA: was signed.

Ordinance 2010-M-030 ORDINANCE CONCERNING THE REGULATING OF PARKING ON PUBLIC OWNED SIDEWALKS AND CURBS WITHIN THE TOWN OF GREENVILLE, INDIANA; A discussion was held about the ordinance.

Ordinance 2010-M-031 ORDINANCE CONCERNING THE REGULATING OF CUTTING THROUGH PARKING LOTS TO AVOID TRAFFIC BACK-UPS WITHIN THE TOWN OF GREENVILLE, INDIANA; A discussion was held about the ordinance.

Ordinance 2010-T-037 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TOWN OF GREEENVILLE ORDINANCE 2010-T-020 AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE DISPOSAL OF DEAD ANIMALS: Reed Striegel with the Floyd County Health Department submitted the ordinance. President Richardson made a motion for unanimous consent and Councilwoman Hayes seconded. Motion passed 4-0. Second reading was completed. Councilman Johnes made a motion and President Richardson seconded. Motion passed 4-0. Third and final reading was completed. President Richardson made the motion and Councilwoman Hayes seconded. Motion passed 4-0.

Water Storage Tanks:

The council held a discussion about the cost for replacement of the Water Storage Tanks. It was suggested that the council look into building the Greenville tank first and possibly constructing another in Galena in about seven (7) years. The cost for mailing out an income survey will be around \$1,500 and needs to be done by July 31st. A rate annualizes should also be completed. The first step in the process for new Water Storage Tanks is to apply for a grant. Second step will be to apply for a low interest loan.

Superintendent Getrost is concerned that the pipe between the tanks may need to be upgraded due to the extra pressure involved.

Superintendent Getrost has spoke with the firm of O.W. Krohn & Associates about a rate increase pass through. Councilman Johnes made a motion to spend up to \$3,000 for the

rate increase from Krohn & Associates and Councilwoman Hayes seconded. Motion passed 4-0.

Councilman Johnes made a motion and President Richardson seconded to have funds set aside for River Valley Economical Development District. Motion passed 4-0,

No further business coming before the Council the meeting was adjourned.
