Dear Residents and Friends,

As you may know by now the town of Greenville has a police department. I would like to present to you the deputies and how you may get in touch with them.

Should an emergency come up you may do the following: 1. Call the numbers listed above.

Call the sheriff's department at 944-6411. Tell them ... 2. your problem and ask them to radio Car 223-that is our police car. Should they not be able to get us, a Floyd County Unit will respond.

As we are a volunteer force our department does not have set patrolling hours. Our car will be available on almost all weekend nights and several nights through the week. During the week I am available for any serious problems.

For us to be effective we need your help in several areas. Firstly, we need you to keep your eyes open. Write down suspicious or speeding cars license numbers and watch your neighbor's property. In order for us to keep the peace we must know the persons that aren't. Secondly, we need you to hold down on the unnecessory type of complaints at all hours. I have had barking dog complaints after 1:00AM at night. Dog calls are a civil matter not a law enforcement one. Our police department does not catch dogs, these call should be directed to the County Dog Warden. Thirdly, and last of all we need your help in the financial area The town of Greenville is in a fiscal crisis and cannot afford new equipment. The town board would like to buy us new equipment but the cupboard is bare. Tax rates have been frozen for several years and with inflation theres not much money left for gas. deputies and myself have sponsered a softball game between the adults (town board, marshalls and town employees) and the Greenville Kids.

We would like to collect donations for the residents for admission to the softball game. If we could get enough support from the town residents through donations we could be a more effective department. The big game is Sunday, August 3rd at 2:00PM. Have a good time and watch the marshalls trounce the kids.
